## Two arrested in bank robbery; now face federal charges

When Gary Wright saw photos of a bank robbery suspect on an Internet news site, he immediately recognized the man in the pinstriped suit.

It was his 18-year-old son.

Gary Wright confronted him about the robbery on Friday afternoon at the Bank of America on North Congress Avenue in Boynton Beach.

On Sunday, Andrew Wright of Palm Beach Gardens went to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office headquarters and turned himself in.

At the same time, the parents of Michael Jeczalik called Boynton Beach Police and said they saw their son and Andrew Wright writing a note for a bank robbery at their home on Northwest 7<sup>th</sup> Court in Boynton Beach on Friday. They also saw Wright leaving their house before the robbery wearing a pinstriped suit and hat and driving a 1997 white Toyota Camry.

Jeczalik, 24, was taken into custody by Boynton Beach Police and told detectives how he gave Wright the suit and gun to commit the robbery. Wright then returned with money in a Bank of America envelope and gave him several hundred dollars.

Jeczalik told detectives that the gun used in the robbery was under the living room couch in his house. After giving police consent to search, crime scene techs found the gun exactly where Jeczalik said it would be.

Wright and Jeczalik are now in federal custody. Federal charges are pending.
