## Parents urged to talk to children about stranger danger

Police want parents and their children to be aware of a potentially dangerous and suspicious incident that occurred Tuesday evening on Renaissance Commons Boulevard.

A witness reported that at 6:55 p.m., she saw two men in a newer model navy Nissan Xterra talking to two young children on bicycles. The children appeared to be 9 and 14 years of age.

The witness, 24, said that the men told the children that they could get into the car and they would drive them home. She said that one of the children was adamantly refusing to get in the car and it appeared that the children did not know the men.

The witness attempted to get the car's license plate but the men drove away before she was able to do so.

Police are urging parents to take this opportunity to remind their children to never get in a car or go anywhere with a stranger.
